

What is the Online Bookstore's eLibrary and what does it contain?

The eLibrary is where the Bookstore keeps a record of all digital course materials that a student has access to. This includes any item bought from the bookstore including eBooks filled through VitalSource and courseware from publishers like McGraw Hill, Pearson, Cengage, Connexions, and Flat World;

To visit the eLibrary, students log into the bookstore with their student login, click on their username located at the top right, and then select "eLibrary." See image below.

Each digital text that a student has access to is listed along with specific details of each product including title, author, and access information (see image on next page). If students need help accessing their materials, they should contact the Online Bookstore Customer Experience team at littlehoop.textbookx.com/help.

TIPS FOR ACCESSING DIGITAL MATERIALS

How do students access digital course materials? Instructions differ based on the publisher and item, but the Bookstore will send students emails with access information. If students don't save the email, they can go to the eLibrary to review the information. *Please note: most access is sent shortly after orders are placed, but some may take longer. The eLibrary will list whether an item is pending fulfillment.

For VitalSource materials, students MUST access them for the first time through their Online Bookstore eLibrary account by clicking "Read Now" (see screenshot below). Once logged in to VitalSource the text will appear on their VitalSource bookshelf. Links to these texts are also available through a student's Learning Management System (LMS: Canvas, Blackboard, D2L).

Other Publishers: For courseware materials from publishers like McGraw Hill, Cengage, or Pearson, the eLibrary will list links to the platform as well as unique access codes.

VitalSource:


VitalSource is a common platform through which students access their digital course materials. If students are new to VitalSource, they should create an account. If they have used VitalSource in the past, they should access their new digital course materials with their existing account. Students should create one account in VitalSource with their school email address for all of their digital course products. They should not create a new account for each text. Links to each specific VitalSource text are stored in the Bookstore eLibrary.
