Program Highlights 2023-24

1. A program instructor resigned. The instructor's classes were reassigned to other faculty.

2. A section of DS 110 was developed and implemented as an online class.

3. Eric Rogness has joined the Indigenous Studies program and has developed two courses - DS-230 Federal, State, and Local Tribal Policies and Relationships and DS -122 Introduction to Spirit Lake Culture, Government and Constitution.

Current Program Goals 2023-24

1. Dakota Language on campus instructor hired, offering in person/hybrid language courses, will develop language video skits by students.

2. Continue community culture outreach, develop CCCC social media content for recruitment.

3. Construction has started for the educational center building, to display CCCC culture artifacts.

Progress on Current Program Goals 2023-24

1. Two hybrid language courses were developed and implemented DSL-250 and DSL 251.

2. Members of the department have volunteered to help author a new version of the History and Culture of the Mni Wakan Oyate, a tribal curriculum guide for public schools in ND.

3. Construction for an educational center is on going.
