Program Highlights 2024-25

1. Enrollment in the program has been increasing and steady. There have been 5 graduates between 2021 and 2025.

2. Technology in the classroom has been updated to accommodate hybrid courses in Drawing I & II.

3. One Fine Arts student led a community extension workshop on beading in the Fall and will be leading another in April.

Current Program Goals 2024-25

[as reported on the Fall 2024 Program Goal Status Report]

1. The Fine Arts Program will be offering Painting I as a hybrid course in the Spring of 2025 in hopes of increasing enrollment in the course and the program.

2. The Fine Arts program will investigate the feasibility of offering Crafts I and Three-Dimensional Design as online courses, making all Fine Arts courses available online.

3. The Fine Arts Program will continue to look for ways to improve online instruction and demonstrations in both Painting and Drawing.

Progress on Current Program Goals 2024-25

1. Painting I is only offered in the Fall, so it is too early to determine.

2. Project kits can be made available for students in Crafts I and Three- Dimensional Design.

3. New technology was added in the art room to improve online demonstrations for Drawing I and II.

Updated/Revised Program Goals for 2025-26

1. The Fine Arts Program will recruit two Fine Art students by June 2026 to help lead and assist in summer art camps and cultural arts workshops through the AICF Traditional Native Art Grant funds available.

2. Promote and integrate the use of existing and emerging technologies in artistic design and course work in Drawing I and II beginning Fall 2025.

3. Organize and present two student juried art exhibitions, one in the Spring and one in the Fall of 2025, to be held in the new CCCC Education Center.
