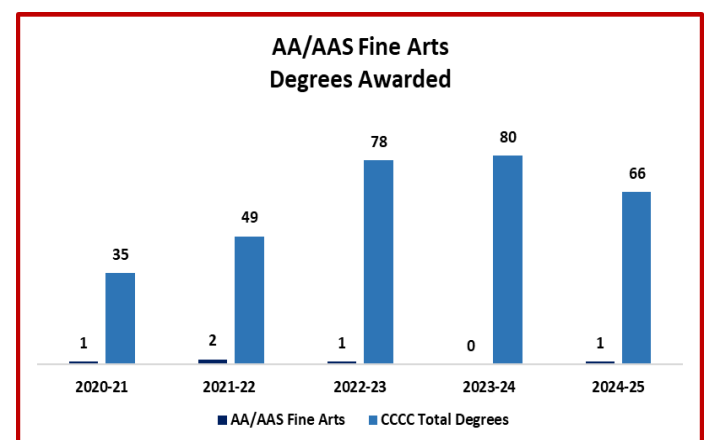
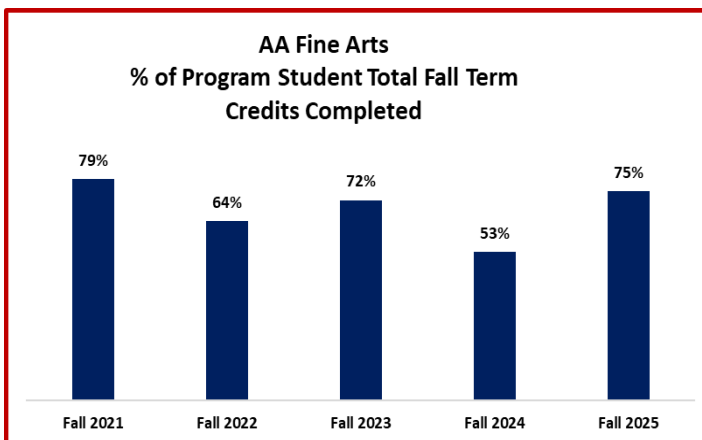
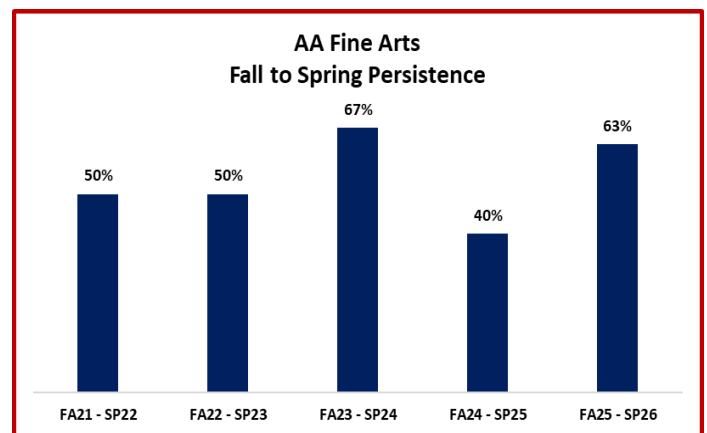
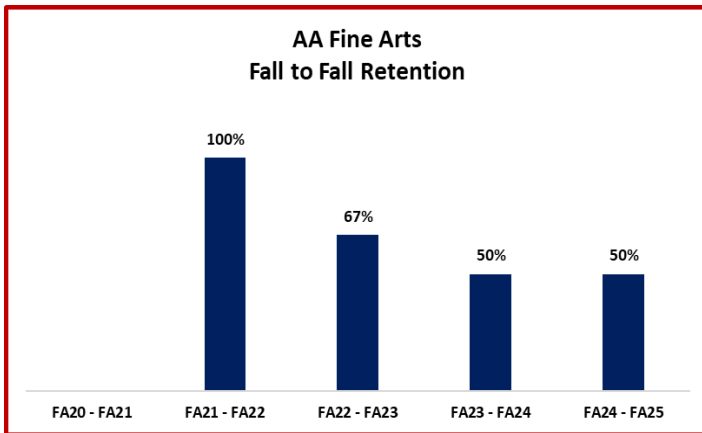
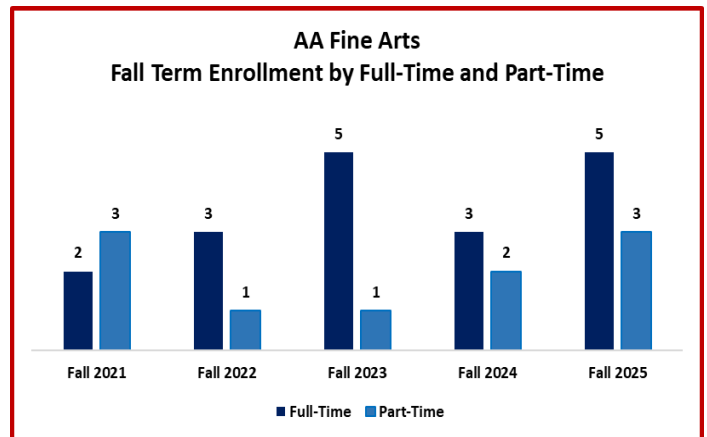
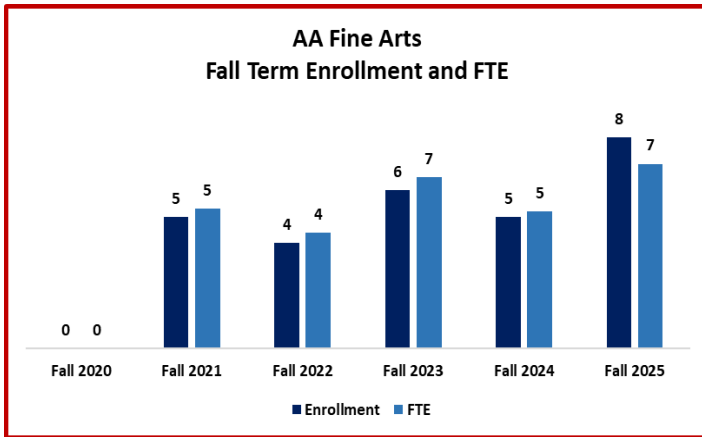




# Spring 2026 Annual Program Snapshot

## Program Highlights 2025-26

1. The Fine Arts program held Art Camp for 15 middle school students, held 5 extension workshops on the Cultural Arts and helped the Oberon 8<sup>th</sup> grade graduating class make ribbon shirts and ribbon skirts for their celebration.
2. The Fine Arts program curated 3 art exhibits and continued to develop the cultural exhibits in the CCCC Education Center, with the help of a graduate from the Fine Arts program, who was hired as the Digital Archival Assistant in June of 2025. In addition, a graduate of the Fine Arts program was awarded the Brenda Bjorlie Award at the Pekin Fine Arts Exhibition with her artwork showcased in the Tribal College Journal.
3. All of the Fine Arts courses are now available as hybrid, making it easier for distance education students to enroll.

## Current Program Goals 2025-26

[as reported on the Fall 2025 Program Goal Status Report]

1. The Fine Arts Program will recruit two Fine Art students by June 2026 to help lead and assist in summer art camps and cultural arts workshops through the AICF Traditional Native Art Grant funds available.
2. Promote and integrate the use of existing and emerging technologies in artistic design and course work in Drawing I and II beginning Fall 2025.
3. Organize and present two student juried art exhibitions, one in the Spring and one in the Fall of 2025, to be held in the new CCCC Education Center.

## Progress on Current Program Goals 2025-26

1. The Fine Arts Program held two beading workshops in the Fall of 2025, one in November and one in December, both led by two Fine Arts students that plan to graduate in Spring of 2026.
2. New technology has been added to the classroom but training is still needed to operate the system.
3. The Education Center held a Spring Art Show on April 23 & 24<sup>th</sup>, 2025 that awarded 20 artists in prize money. CCCC Fine Arts Gallery opened the exhibit on loan from the North Dakota Council of the Arts, *On the Edge of the Wind*. An opening reception was held on November 4<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

## Updated/Revised Program Goals for 2026-27

1. Meet with curriculum committee to change pre-requisites for Painting II & Drawing II to none to increase enrollment in courses.
2. Hold 2 painting workshops over the summer as a way to advertise the Fine Arts program and increase enrollment.
- 3 By invitation from the North Dakota Council of the Arts, I will be exhibiting my work at the State Capital Building from September to December, 2027. My goal is to have students and Spirit Lake artists join me in exhibiting their work and use this opportunity to showcase Spirit Lake artists and CCCC Fine Arts students. I have 3 former students and 2 current students that have agreed to display their work along with mine. This will be a great opportunity to promote the Fine Arts program at CCCC.
